#### NAIDOC Celebration - *the strength and value of cultural connection and respect*



Did you know that 20% of our students are Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander?

We respect and value the diversity within our community. On Monday 21 July we celebrated NAIDOC Week. It was a very meaningful and successful event for our school community.

From engaging in the traditional art and dance workshops to trying new foods and encouraging our students to do the same. It was a respectful and culturally rich experience. Our guests were particularly impressed by the excellent behaviour by the students and commented on how often they were thanked throughout the day.

Our guests, John, David and Jon Jon prepared the Kup-Murri (traditional lunch) for our school. As this is considered men's business, their involvement was both culturally significant and deeply appreciated. They also went hunting to provide turtle and dugong which were shared as part of the Kup-Murri and done respectfully and lawfully under a permit. Traditional hunting is based on knowledge that has been passed down through generations, including when, where, and how to hunt in a way that respects the land and its animals. It follows cultural protocols and is done under legal permits, which are only granted when specific guidelines are met. While some animals involved may be protected under general circumstances, Traditional Owners are granted limited rights under the law to hunt certain species for cultural purposes. These practices are carried out with great care, ensuring sustainability, respect, and the continued health of animal populations.

There were two teams working on two separate challenges. One team entered the "On Stage Performance" category, which required multiple robots in costume, moving in time to music or telling a story. This team came second by just one point after completing an interview with the judges and performing three times. Their performance told the story of a princess who is stolen by a dragon and rescued by a gallant knight on horseback.

The second team built and programmed two robots to play soccer. These robots had to detect the ball, manoeuvre it into the goal, and defend their own goal against the opposing team. In a nail-biting final that ended 1–1 at full time, the game went into extra time. The Calen team scored a golden goal to secure the win and bring home the trophy.

Congratulations to all the students for their resilience in preparing their robots and tackling the challenges on the day!

## **NAIDOC Week 2025** – Celebrating Strength, Vision & Legacy

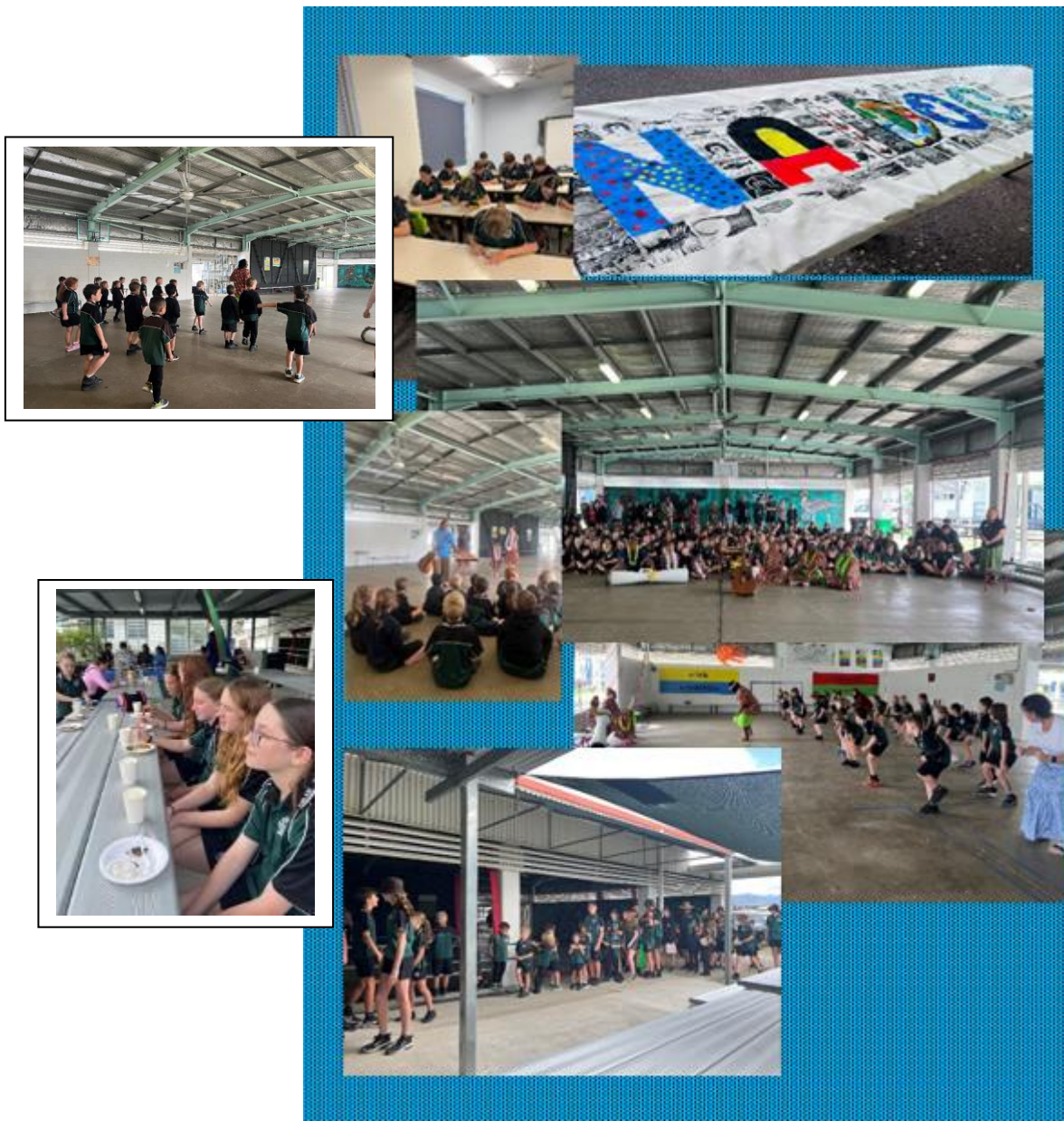

Students across all year levels took part in a variety of meaningful cultural activities. Primary students enjoyed an engaging Traditional Dance workshop led by Seba Bourne and Palai Mabo. High school students participated in a lino printing workshop led by Tasha Majid, creating artwork inspired by culture and symbolism. Students also collaborated to design and paint a school NAIDOC banner, which now hangs proudly as a symbol of unity, respect, and learning.

We were honoured to have John, David and Jon Jon prepare a Kup-Murri for our school community. Taking the day off work to support our celebration, their involvement, considered men’s business, was both culturally significant and deeply appreciated. Over the weekend, they also went hunting to provide turtle and dugong for the meal, done respectfully and lawfully under a cultural permit.

These practices follow strict legal and cultural protocols, ensuring they are carried out with sustainability, care, and respect.

We extend our deepest thanks to all involved in helping us celebrate NAIDOC Week and acknowledge the strength of the next generation as they carry forward a proud and enduring legacy.

### STUDENT DRESS CODE

All Prep to Year 12 students are to be dressed in the correct uniform at all times. This includes extra-curricular situations that require our students to act as representatives of our school. Our Student Dress Code is supported and endorsed by our P & C.

The Calen District State College school community expects students to wear the uniform without alterations or additions. Our uniform, which has been chosen in consultation with students, staff and parents, is worn in the interests of school spirit and identity and allows all students to participate in all school activities in a comfortable and safe manner.

Students are not to wear jewellery apart from a watch, a flat signet ring, 2 x plain studs or sleepers in ears – no other body piercing is permitted. Make-up and nail polish is not to be worn at school.

Students are required to wear black shoes with impervious uppers (eg leather) Jogger style shoes with leather uppers are ideal and can be purchased at most shoe stores.

Students are required to wear either the school hat or a wide-brimmed hat during any outdoor activity.
